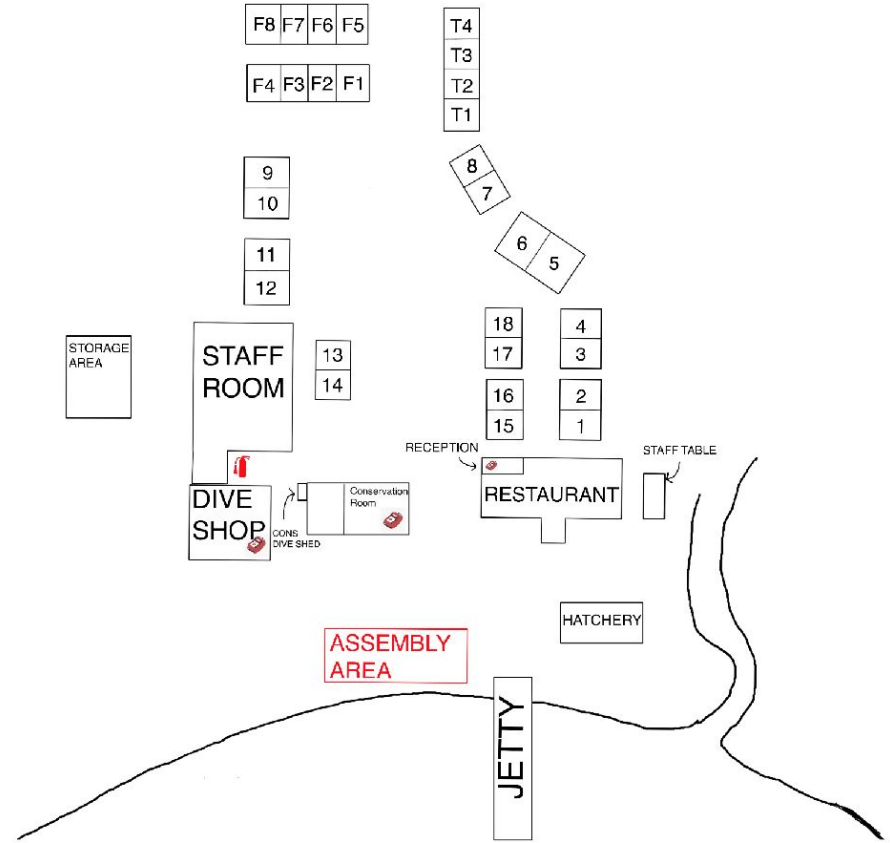
The Participant

TURTLE PATROL RULES

1. Make sure to always stay behind the interns and facilitators
2. Be silent and as quiet as possible when moving around the mama turtle
3. Always observe what the interns and facilitators are doing before proceeding with any activity
4. Your role is as important as the egg handlers: the scribe!
5. Always be observant and focused during the whole process
6. Enjoy!

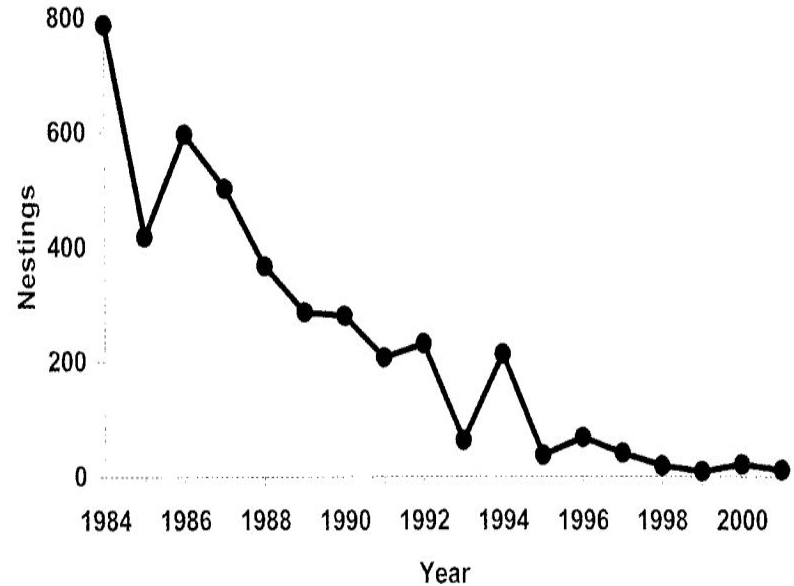


Figure 3. Nesting trends in leatherback turtles, Terengganu.
